Length

The abstract should not be longer than 300 words, and the final paper should not exceed 7,000 words, including objectives, methodology and expected findings.

Format

Includes the title, author(s) with affiliations, clear headings, concise text, proper formatting, visuals, and a strong conclusion.

Deadline

Abstracts must be submitted by **April 15, 2025**.

NB: The date for the final submission of your Abstract shall not be later than the 15/4/2025 & the final submission of your full paper shall not be later than 30/5/2025 if your Abstract have been approved.
